Parish Council Casual Vacancy

Due to the resignation of Cllr John Weir a bye-election will be held to fill this vacancy if within 14 days of 16th November ten electors for the parish give notice in writing claiming such an

election to the Returning Officer. The address for the Returning Officer is Maidstone Borough Council, Maidstone House, King Street, Maidstone, Kent ME15 6JQ. If no such notice is given the Parish Council will fill the vacancy by co-option. If no bye-election is held and you would be interested in standing for co-option please contact Alison in the Parish Office for more information.

Parish Council Elections – May 2016

In May 2016 the Parish Council is up for re-election and if you are interested in becoming a Councillor and feel you have something to offer the village, please contact Alison, the Parish Clerk, for more information. The criteria includes: you are British, or a citizen of the Commonwealth or the European Union; are 18 years of age or over; are registered to vote in the area or if you have lived, worked or owned property in Marden for at least 12 months before the election. If you would like to get involved with the work of the Parish Council why not consider standing for election?

Marden Neighbourhood Plan

After numerous village consultations and meetings over the past couple of years, the Steering Group are currently making final amendments to the draft Marden Neighbourhood Plan document before it goes for editing. It will then be forwarded to the RICS Neighbourhood Planning Independent Examiner Referral Service before submission to Maidstone Borough Council. Many thanks to everybody who have participated in this important exercise so far.

Planning Update:

Widehurst Solar Farm- 15/505971 – This application has been discussed by Marden Parish Council Planning Committee and is now with Maidstone Borough Council Planning Officer awaiting a decision.

Highwood Green – Both Parish and Borough Councillors recently met with Redrow, the developers at Highwood Green, to discuss various issues such as: the removal of the 'pineapples' which are out of keeping in a rural environment; Mead Fleet will be employed as the Management Company for the development who will be responsible amongst other things for the upkeep of open space including the grassed area at the front. Street lighting will be in operation soon and parking bays for the residents of Spring Grove Cottages will be installed before completion in 2016.

Planning Representation

Councillors would like to reiterate that any representations that the Parish Council make on planning applications are recommendations only, and that the final decision is with

Maidstone Borough Council's Development Control Department and Planning Committee – we are purely consultees.

Marden Memorial Hall Roof

By the time you read this newsletter the Memorial Hall roof replacement will have been completed and we hope you agree it is looking resplendent and congratulations to the contractors Artisan/Finkis Construction and Academy Consulting for the excellent and efficient job they have all undertaken.

Marden Parish Newsletter

We have been approached by Marden Village Club (which is a charitable trust) who has generously offered to sponsor the Parish Newsletter towards its production. In return, the Village Club will place a flyer in each publication for a year. We are trialling this initially and if successful, will be looking for potential sponsors (village groups not commercial businesses) going forward.

Parking Restrictions

You will be aware of Maidstone Borough Council's proposed new parking restrictions in the village which have provisionally been agreed at the Maidstone Joint Transportation Board. It was recommended to amend the current Monday-Friday 1.30pm-2pm restriction to Monday - Friday 10.30am-11am which should leave sufficient parking for businesses and customers and that the Monday-Saturday 8am-6.30pm restriction opposite the busy Maidstone Road junction should be changed to double yellow lines on a small section on the bend near the Post Office. This should considerably improve road safety particularly as it is a difficult junction for larger vehicles to manoeuvre. The effects on businesses should be no different during the day as the restriction is the same and reduced outside of the operational hours. Remember there is parking available in the nearby public car park.

The change to the lay-by in the High Street is proposed by the Joint Transportation Board not to go ahead. A decision will be made by the Strategic Planning, Sustainability and Transportation Committee on 10th November.

Public Car Park

Maidstone Borough Council have placed a Restriction Order at the public car park behind the Library which will now be closed and no parking from 7.15am-8.15am - Monday-Friday. This will mean Penalty Charge Notices can be more easily enforced. Hopefully this will now deter all day parking in the public car park.

Speeding in the Village

The Parish Council are well aware of residents' concerns on safely crossing roads in Marden particularly in the High Street area and Pattenden Lane. Councillors recently met with our County Councillor Paulina Stockell and Kent Highways on how we could help to overcome the issue by possibly installing a pedestrian crossing. If funding becomes available, a feasibility study would need to be undertaken initially and Kent Highways would then make recommendations. Undoubtedly it will be a slow and drawn-out process!

There are also ongoing speeding issues in Chainhurst and Kent Highways have been authorised by our County Councillor to undertake a traffic survey in that area. Additionally, the Community Policing Team (CPT) have recently undertaken speed checks along the Goudhurst Road.

Rural Speeding Working Group

At the meeting in September, chaired by Helen Grant MP and attended by Cllr Childs, it was reported that the Maidstone Community Safety Unit (CSU) are piloting a scheme based solely on risk assessment and not reliant on a fatality before action is triggered. A static camera will be trialled in Sandling Road in Maidstone, an area known for commuters speeding as they cut through to the A229. The benefit would be the Police could prosecute from the information gained from these cameras. The results of the survey will be discussed at the next meeting in late November. It was also announced that Kent County Council are looking at enforcing a 20mph limit outside every school in the county.

Speed Watch

Once again we are appealing for more speed watch volunteers to get this scheme off the ground. After initial training, it would only take an hour or two of your time per session. If you would like to be involved, please contact Erika in the Parish Office on 01622 832305 or email erika.mardenpc@btconnect.com. Once we are up and running, our village PCSO Nicola Morris will also be invited to attend some of the Speed Watch sessions to help deter speeding through the village. Please note, because of the current National Speed Limit in Chainhurst, volunteers are unable to undertake Speed Watch in that area. Come on Marden we need you!

What's going on in Marden?

Saint Nicholas Christmas Tree Festival - Friday 11th December and Saturday 12th December – As part of the 'Marden at Christmas' event, everyone is welcome to take a decorated tree for display in Marden Church (complete with battery lights) for all to enjoy on Friday 11th December between 2pm-6pm and collect on Sunday 2pm-4pm. The children will also perform a concert on Friday at 7pm and 'Antiphony' will be holding a concert in the Church on Saturday evening.

'Clean for the Queen'/Parish Litter Pick – Saturday 5th March 2016 - 'Clean for the Queen' is a campaign to clear up Britain in time for the Queen's 90th birthday in April 2016. When she came to the throne, litter was much less of a problem than it is today. So the Parish Council have decided to tie it in with our next village litter pick.

This year's **Spring litter pick** was a great success and the Parish Council will co-ordinate another tidying up exercise in the Parish on Saturday 5th March. Scout Christmas Post

Marden Scout Group are going to run a Christmas Post service. Nearer Christmas you will see post boxes in various places around the village (shops, businesses and the Scout HQ etc). Users post their cards (restricted to Marden Parish and Collier Street), and a suggested donation of 20–50p per card into the boxes. Cards/money will be collected periodically until last posting date (Fri 18th Dec). The cards will then be sorted and 'franked' and Scouts/Cubs/Beavers (with parents) will deliver the cards on the 19th December (the last Saturday before Christmas). Marden Minors Football Club

The Parish Council is currently working with Chris Price, the new Chairman of Marden Minors Football Club (MMFC), who has a new vision to expand the club and provide more opportunities for children in the village to play football. They are hoping to use the Playing Field as their main base rather than split matches at different venues and are also aiming to attain Kent league status. The Parish Council is fully supportive of encouraging sport and exercise in the village particularly with the volume of children that will increase with the new developments.

Kimura Shukokai Karate Kent

Kimura Shukokai Karate Kent club run classes on Friday evenings between 6pm-7pm in the John Banks Hall at the Memorial Hall. The Karate Sensei, Chris Simpson, has a great vision that one day some of the students from the Marden Dojo will join the England squad and compete in international events! Update on Parish Matters:

- **Litter Bins** – Councillors held a meeting with Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) regarding litter bin replacements and MBC have provisionally agreed to replace 6 bins, but the Parish Council will have to contribute to 50% of costs. MBC will continue to maintain and empty all litter bins in the parish.
- **Street Name Plates** – we have sent Maidstone Borough Council evidence of all the existing street signs in the Parish showing which signs need repairs and/or replacements. Hopefully this work will be undertaken in the not too distant future!
- **Anti-Social Behaviour** – If you want to report any anti-social behaviour, please call 101 as soon as possible so PCSO Nicola Morris can provide sufficient evidence to Maidstone Community Safety Unit. Nicola has also been monitoring activity in various hot spot areas in the village in the evenings.
- **The Kent Air Ambulance** clothing bin is frequently overflowing and not being emptied regularly. Therefore to free up an extra parking space, we have asked Maidstone Borough Council (who own the car park) to remove it. You can put out your discarded fabrics/clothing with the green recycling bin.
- **Fingerposts** – We are aware that some of the Parish fingerposts need attention and we are endeavouring to find a

painter who would be interested in refurbishing them. If you know of anybody, please ask them to contact the Parish Office on 01622 832305 or email mardenpc@btconnect.com

● **Public Conveniences** – Please note the public conveniences will be open from 8am to 4pm from November to March.

● **Marden Playing Field** – Our PCSO Nicola Morris has been regularly monitoring anti-social behaviour around the Playing Field. If you see any anti-social behaviour, please call 101 as soon as you have seen an incident.

● **Napoleon Drive Play Area** – the Parish Council are still in the process of transferring this play area from Taylor Wimpey, but hopefully in 2016/17 we will be able to replace the current play equipment for the under 5's dependent on Developer Contribution monies. Councillors did discuss removing some of the hedgerow between the Playing Field and the Napoleon Drive play area, but to put residents' minds at rest, it has now been decided that it will just be given a general 'haircut' instead.



● **Southons Field** – it is pleasing to see residents and their children using the new Play Trail area (above) and the Parish

Council are currently looking at installing signage and a litter bin. Winter opening times are: November-March: 8am to 4pm.



A Week in the Life of the Chairman of the Amenities Committee

To give residents a flavour of some of the work Parish Councillors get involved in, here's a summary of a week in August. Prior to going on holiday, I finished drafting the Autumn Parish Newsletter for Councillors to cast an eye over and agree before going to print. As usual I came back to a plethora of emails relating to Parish Council matters. As there was an Amenities meeting on the Tuesday, which I chair, I spent time catching up on amenity issues and outstanding items.

On the Tuesday evening, the Parish Clerk and I met up with the new chairman of Marden Minors Football Club to discuss the internal state of the changing rooms in the Playing Field and listened to his new vision for the club which we would discuss further at Full Council. We dashed back to the Parish Office for the Amenities meeting. On Thursday I undertook the Parish Clerk's appraisal and then we drove around the Parish taking photos of all the street signs so we had evidence to present to Maidstone Borough Council (MBC) on any work that needed to be carried out. This turned out to be a hugely time-consuming task for both of us as our intention was to put together a spreadsheet adding all the photos which we could then place onto the new Mapping System that had recently been purchased. On the Friday myself and other Councillors, including Borough Councillors, met with the representative from MBC responsible for litter bins, street names etc in the borough. The meeting was primarily to discuss our concerns with the litter bins in the village. Last task of the week was to type up notes from the Clerk's appraisal. All this was in between running my fitness classes and trying to get my head around ideas for the new 'Marden in Bloom' project which I have helped to instigate.

I would just like to reiterate Parish Councillors are unpaid volunteers and spend a good deal of their time on parish matters - some of the Councillors also work full time. However, I have personally found it extremely interesting and challenging learning about local issues and becoming involved in the village, and would encourage anybody who feels they have an interest to stand for election in May 2016.

Local Heroes

Firstly, Robin Judd, who was a Marden Parish Councillor and Chairman for many years as well as Mayor of Maidstone, and his wife Barbara who have left a great legacy to the village with the array of trees they planted in Southons Field when it was in their ownership. Representatives from the 'Kent Men of Trees' are always amazed by the range of trees, some of which are quite rare, and undoubtedly helps when Marden is awarded one of the top 10 villages in Kent. Thank you Robin and Barbara - you are really special 'Local Heroes'.

Secondly, the Chairman of the Parish Council, Dorothy Reed, who has dedicated many years to the parish and held the position of Chairman for 17 years. So many parishioners share issues with Dorothy which she always tries to deal with. Dorothy also gets involved with numerous other village groups including the Thursday Club, coffee mornings at The Allen's and Short Mat Bowls. She particularly likes to support residents at the Stilebridge Site. Dorothy has helped to support so many people in the village and the amount of time she has dedicated over the years is mind-boggling. Thank you Dorothy for being

Clearing Snow and Ice

Kent County Council (KCC) is responsible for clearing snow and ice from roads and roadside footways (pavements) in Marden, and the B2079 through the village is one of KCC's primary salting routes. During periods of severe winter, other authorities including Maidstone Borough Council and Marden Parish Council may also provide assistance if they have resources available. If the Parish Council is able to assist KCC to keep these routes clear of snow and ice, our priority will be to help clear the busiest lengths of footway in the village centre which is the North side of the main road between Church Green shops and the bus stop near Haffenden Close; and the South side of main road between the bus stop near the Library car park and High Street shops.

You can clear snow and ice from pavements and paths yourself. It's unlikely that you'll be sued or held responsible if someone is injured on a path if you've cleared it carefully. The simple guidelines below have been published by the Government and KCC:

When you clear snow and ice:

- do it early in the day – it's easier to move fresh, loose snow
- don't use water – it might refreeze and turn to black ice
- use salt if possible - it will melt the ice or snow and stop it from refreezing overnight
- you can use ash & sand if you don't have enough salt – it will provide grip underfoot
- pay extra attention when clearing steps and steep pathways – using more salt may help
- be careful when you are shoveling snow – ensure your own safety and visibility, especially when it's dark

NB – The salt / grit mix from the yellow salt bins may only be used to clear public roads and paths, and must not be spread on private drives or pathways.

Please also help any neighbours who may require assistance. For comprehensive information, please visit the Kent County Council website www.kent.gov.uk on their winter service provision. From the home page, click on 'Roads and Travel' then 'What we Look after' then 'Winter Service'. It provides useful information on salt bins, gritting routes, how and when KCC salt the roads, clearing snow in the community and the latest weather updates.

Community Warden Update

Community Wardens aim to help prevent crime by encouraging the building of a strong community and discouraging low-level anti-social behaviour. Wardens do not take on the work of the police, but act as a friendly visible presence within the community and you will often find our Community Warden Mira walking around the village. She helps raise awareness of problems such as scam mail, bogus callers and rogue traders. Mira helps to identify and tackle other local issues needing attention ranging from abandoned vehicles to welfare concerns. Wardens can offer support, advice and can refer to many partner agencies to help you. Wardens encourage social inclusion – there is no need for anyone to be alone or isolated. Mira is currently undertaking Winter road safety talks and will also look to bring some outreach workers to the village

regarding drug issues.

Also Mira has been liaising with Golding Homes who have recently run Archery Tag sessions and now the Childrens' Centre have arranged events at The Cockpit open space on Monday evenings. A fun day was held on 29th October at The Cockpit by Golding Homes and awareness sessions will be run regarding the defibrillator.

Marden Defibrillator

The crew from Marden fire station and Kent Air Ambulance, supported by SECAMB, will be running a number of defibrillator and cardiopulmonary resuscitation (CPR) awareness sessions. These are designed to give an awareness of the new public access defibrillator, which is located on the phone box at the library. The sessions are open to anyone around the village, so keep an eye out for a poster for more details.
