## Memorial Hall Roof Update

As previously advised, the Marden Memorial Hall Management Committee approached the Parish Council last year informing Councillors that after several years of trying to obtain funding for the hall roof replacement, it had been unsuccessful. The Parish Council was therefore asked to consider the possibility of obtaining a Public Works Loan (PWL). The issue was raised at successive Full Council Meetings and details were provided on the Parish Council website and Spring 2015 edition of the Newsletter. Residents were encouraged to offer their views and these were considered in the decision-making process.

Following extensive discussion, it was agreed that the only possible means of funding the necessary works was for the Parish Council to obtain a PWL and it was agreed to raise the Precept in January 2015 to include annual PWL repayments.

Academy Consulting then prepared the work specification and tender documents. They have been generous enough to offer these services free of charge and will continue to project manage the works. Tenders have now been received from three local roofing contractors and these are currently being considered by Councillors.

## Village Mounting Block

We are pleased to announce that after prolonged negotiation with Kent Highways, the damaged village Mounting Block was partly rebuilt and reinstalled. It has been sited close to its original position on the High Street, but further from the junction to avoid damage. We hope you agree it looks pretty good – the History Group certainly endorses it! A London Plane tree was also planted close-by and many thanks to Kent Highways for undertaking the works and for making an excellent job of it.

## Village Summer Play Scheme

We are delighted to announce that the Village Summer Play Scheme will once again run all day - from 9.30am-3.30pm and will operate from Monday 27th July to Friday 7th August at Marden Scout HQ. The scheme is open to village children from the ages of 5 to 11 year (children must have reached the age of 5 by 1st September 2014) and the theme this year will be the 'Circus'. Registration forms are available from Alison in the Parish Office and the Primary School Office from 1st June. A list of all the planned activities will be available at the same time. All staff are ready to go and excited about this year with Jen Hindley being our manager leading the team again. Reduced fees are available if places are pre-booked.

## Speeding in the Village

Residents have told us about their concerns regarding speeding and the potential dangers to the Parish. This is illustrated by the unfortunate car accident at the Primary School in February. Our MP Helen Grant voiced her concerns to Kent County Council (KCC) and the Parish Clerk provided further evidence of the issues affecting Goudhurst Road. Unfortunately Paul Carter, Leader of Kent County Council, has advised that the expenditure on road safety measures in Marden is unlikely to be forthcoming. However, our County Councillor Paulina Stockell announced at the Annual Parish meeting, that KCC were re-investigating the issues outside the school further so watch this space!

A Rural Speeding Working Group has recently been established in Kent. Kent Police has made road safety a prime objective and the next meeting will take place shortly. We hope to update you in the next Newsletter.

## Play Trail in Southons Field

The Parish Council is currently exploring the idea of a Play Trail in Southons Field and this would be designed to *continued*

blend in with the natural environment. Councillors have recently met up with 3 play equipment suppliers to look at ideas and costs. The intention is to install a Play Trail designed for children and hopefully expand this to provide equipment for adults if the necessary funding can be found. With a bit of luck, this may be up and running over the Summer holiday period.

## CCTV

The Parish Council recently applied for matched funding to purchase CCTV equipment but unfortunately were unsuccessful in its bid. This is needed to monitor hot spot areas around the village particularly outside the public toilets and the play area. However, because of recent incidents at both the Public Toilets and play area, Councillors have agreed to go ahead with purchasing one camera which can be moved to different locations. Hopefully this will be a good deterrent. A mobile CCTV camera was recently deployed in a number of streets at the request of our PCSO Nicola Morris and it is hoped this has reduced incidents of anti-social behaviour.

## Dog Fouling

Marden Parish Council are taking the issue of dog fouling, particularly in the Playing Field, very seriously. We cannot over-stress the dangers dog faeces poses – Toxocariasis is found in dog faeces and can cause partial blindness. Children are particularly susceptible and the disease affects up to 100 children every year in the UK.

In February, a Marden Minors football match had to be abandoned due to a large amount of dog faeces on the pitch. The Clerk subsequently met with Maidstone Borough Council's (MBC) Environmental Enforcement Officer and the Community Warden. The field is owned by the Parish Council but controlled by Dog Control Orders and enforced by MBC. A leaflet drop was undertaken by MBC to the houses surrounding the pitch informing them of 'Dog Watch'. Several articles appeared in the press regarding the abandonment of the football match and the Parish Clerk has provided evidence to MBC.

Mira Marden, our Community Warden, has also been talking to dog owners about the issue and once again we appeal for all dog owners to be vigilant and help to tackle this vulgar and irresponsible issue. It's such a shame that just a few uncaring dog owners spoil things for others.

## Public Toilets and Vandalism

The refurbishment of the public toilets was finally completed and now looks a lot smarter. It is with deep disappointment that there have already been a number of incidents. If you witness any vandalism, you must report this to the Police by calling 101. The current opening times are 7am to 8pm but may be reviewed if further vandalism occurs.

## Sewage Issues - Southern Water

A further meeting with Southern Water took place in April and some remedial works have been undertaken in Marden Road, Staplehurst. We are advised that the problems experienced in Marden are due to surface water penetrating the foul water

drainage system. It is hoped that a Strategy will be put in place by September 2015.

## Surface Water Management Plan

A further meeting regarding the Surface Water Management Plan for Marden was held on 15th May and a report of this will be available in the next newsletter and on the Parish Council website.

## Kent County Council Library Consultation

KCC has published its favoured option for the future of Kent Library, Registration and Archive Services and the intention is to form a Charitable Trust. A KCC Library representative addressed the March Parish Council meeting. Councillors firmly believe Marden Library to be special; it is a beacon of good practice and is proud to house the Marden Heritage Centre. Councillors were keen to get this message over to KCC decision-makers and responded to the formal consultation accordingly.

## Conifers at the Playing Field

There is a hedge of mature conifers in the Playing Field to the Western boundary. The trees have been badly damaged and need to be removed. It is hoped this work will be undertaken shortly and Golding Homes have promised to provide a replacement boundary – a wall or fence.

## What's on in Marden?

### Village Siren – Saturday 6 June

The History Group will be "sounding" the Siren at 3pm on Saturday 6 June to commemorate 'D Day'. This marks the Normandy Landings on 6th June 1944 where thousands of Allied troops landed on the beaches of Normandy at the start of the major offensive against the enemy – don't panic - it's just a signal that the Big Music Picnic is about to start!

### Marden's Big Music Picnic – Southons Field – Saturday 6 June

This was a wonderful event last year and we hope it will be even better this year. There are some acts you will have seen before and some new ones, and of course you can sing along to your old favourites with the Village Voices choir who will also be singing a few WW2 songs to celebrate VE Day. There will be lots of other attractions – children's races, tug-of-war, coconut shy, School country dancing, a bouncy assault course, face painting and Children's Craft Stall with the Bellringer's BBQ and tea and cakes from the Mothers' union. The Gates will open at 3.30pm and the event finishes at 8.30pm. Tickets cost £5 for adults, £4 for Seniors and £2 for Children (5-15) – tickets are only available at the gate.
